Ugg! How Do I Find Peace These Days!

If you read the news, you will see that our world is anything but peaceful right now, anything but shalom. If you are like me, at times you are having trouble finding peace with all that's going on--every day is a new source of stress!

Shalom...Shalom is this wonderful word throughout the Hebrew Scriptures, which lies behind the English word "peace." *Shalom* is one of the key words and images in the Bible for salvation--all things being made right! The Hebrew word refers most commonly to a person being uninjured and safe, whole and sound. In the New Testament, *shalom* is revealed as the reconciliation of all things to God through the work of Christ as Colossians 1:19-20 states: "God was pleased . . . through Christ to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through Christ's blood, shed on the cross." *Shalom* experienced is multidimensional, complete well-being — physical, psychological, social, and spiritual; it flows from all of one's relationships being put right — with God, within oneself, and with others.

Shalom and Justice are Intertwined: Shalom is not achieved without justice. A society that is unjust cannot truly be said to have shalom, as everyone's well-being and rights are not being upheld.

Justice as a Prerequisite for Shalom: Justice, in the sense of giving each person their due, is a necessary foundation for shalom. It ensures that everyone has the basic needs met and their rights protected, contributing to a more harmonious and peaceful society. Shalom extends beyond just the absence of conflict; it includes a flourishing and thriving community where relationships are healthy and well-being is promoted in peace and wholeness. Psalm 85:10-11, speaks of how when all is right, justice & peace shall kiss!

And somehow this all is connected to our Baptism. First and foremost, Baptism is about us being children of God—a foundation that carries us our whole lives. AND, as we live as God's children, God works through us, <u>yes us,</u> to love others and change this broken world. The blessing of our baptism spills out to others, and indeed is meant to transform ALL of creation!

It is about the justice of God and the God of justice. Because justice is God righting the wrongs, the Lord brings about <u>shalom</u> transformation so all of creation is made new, so baptism is not just about my well-being, or the well-being of my congregation, <u>Baptism is about the flourishing of ALL!</u>—every human, every creature, every mountain, every stream, every tree! Shalom in ALL of creation.

So, when you are stressed about personal or world happenings, and are not feeling peace, remember <u>2 promises</u> through your baptism.

First, that you are a <u>beloved child of God!</u> The most powerful, most loving Being in the universe holds you lovingly in his hands! The Good Shepherd's got your back!

Second, that <u>God is working through you</u> and through other followers of Jesus (and even those who aren't followers) to bring about Shalom, peace to our world!

Also, it helps, sometimes, when we are feeling overwhelmed by the events of this world, to take action, even if it is very small, to help bring about shalom, peace. It helps us hold onto HOPE. If you are feeling this way, what can you do to bring a little more love, more hope, in this world?—maybe caring for a neighbor, donating or volunteering at church or a non-profit, sign up to be on alert to be an observer/videographer for immigration

raids, write your representative, take time to pray. And never forget it's ALL in the hands of our God, who loves us enough to die for us and calls us beloved!

Also, you, the Westview Family, help me feel <u>shalom</u> in your care for me, each other, and the needy (especially the unhoused) in our community.
